Plants and Specific Planting Plans

THE TRAIL WILL BE NEARLY .75 MILES and utilize the existing east-west farm road and a small portion of the extremely rocky field on the most easterly side of the property. The existing fields will otherwise remain open. We anticipate that the planting of the trail may take two years. We will start this Spring utilizing a mixture of bare root stock and container stock. The bare root stock is considerably cheaper, but we do not want to commit to using large quantities of it until the survival rate has been determined. Therefore, the Spring planting this year will be a "trial run" of the bare root stock.



THE FOLLOWING IS A SPECIMEN LIST of the native species we intend to plant along the trail. This may be added to as the trail progresses.

- ☘ American Cranberry Viburnum – *Viburnum trilobum*
- ☘ Arrowwood Viburnum – *Viburnum dentatum*
- ☘ Summersweet – *Clethra alnifolia*
- ☘ Blueberry – *Vaccinium cyanococcus*
- ☘ Elderberry – *Sambucus canadensis*
- ☘ Shadblow – *Amelanchier canadensis*
- ☘ Bayberry – *Myrica pensylvanica*
- ☘ Winterberry – *Ilex verticillata*
- ☘ Inkberry – *Ilex glabra*
- ☘ Pussywillow – *Salix discolor*
- ☘ Chokeberry – *Aronia melanocarpa*
- ☘ Sumac – *Rhus glabra, typhina*
